

Resource Conservationist- Erosion and Sediment Pollution Control Technician Job Announcement

The Armstrong Conservation District (ACD) Board of Directors will be accepting applications for the full time position of Resource Conservationist-Erosion and Sediment Pollution Control Technician until September 15, 2021 or until the position is filled. A person in this position will have an array of technical duties related to administration of the Chapter 102-Erosion and Sediment Pollution Control program. Job responsibilities include, but are not limited to: reviewing E&S Control plans, processing programmatic permits, conducting project site inspections, investigating delegated complaints, writing inspection reports, and effectively communicating with the public, permittees, plan designers, and cooperating agencies. The ability to interpret surveys, maps, and plan drawings is required. The successful candidate will have at a minimum, a Bachelor's degree in Natural Resource Management, or a related field. Experience performing Erosion and Sediment Pollution Control activities, organizational management, project coordination, grant writing, and other related areas will be beneficial. Applicants must possess a valid Pa. Driver's license for at least 3 years and provide for their own transportation as needed.
