# 2022 Fruit Tree Descriptions

---

## Armstrong Conservation District

### APPLE

**CrimsonCrisp®**– CrimsonCrisp is a medium sized apple with a very attractive crimson red color over 95% of the surface. It produces very firm, crisp fruits with a tart, complex flavor. The tree is very grower friendly and harvests mid-season. CrimsonCrisp is scab resistant.

**Enterprise**– This is a late-maturing, deep red apple with good keeping qualities. Fruit is uniform and medium to large in size. Tree is vigorous and spreading, with a good annual bearing. Enterprise is resistant to fire blight, cedar apple rust and apple scab.

**Aztec Fuji®**- Aztec® is a full-colored, blush-type that harvests late season. The tree is healthy and vigorous, and the fruit exhibits the traditional, sweet flavor of Fuji.

**GoldRush**- Best known for its remarkable keeping qualities. GoldRush will keep in regular cold storage approximately 10 or 11 months. Fruit is crisp and tart off the tree and develops its sugars in storage. GoldRush resists oxidation when cut, making a nice, yellow sauce, and the fruit bakes very well. Tree is non-vigorous, slightly upright with a semi-spur habit. Resistant to scab and mildew.

**Granny Smith**- A late, green, tart apple, maturing in early November. Develops a red blush in the Northeast. High-quality eating apple with a storage life equal to Fuji.

**Honeycrisp**- The fruit is mostly orange-red with a yellow background. This crisp, juicy, sweet-tart apple has a rich flavor that has made it “#1” in taste panels. The fruit averages 3 inches and up, matures ten days before Red Delicious and stores well. Tree is non-vigorous, has outstanding winter hardiness and is late blooming.

**Kumeu Crimson® Braeburn**- Medium to large fruit with typical tart flavor and long storage life. Fruit colors two or three weeks ahead of other Braeburns, finishing 100% red with prominent stripe. Tree is spur type with low vigor. Kumeu Crimson® Braeburn matures in early November in Southern Pennsylvania.

**Liberty**– A mid-season, medium-sized, yellow-fleshed dessert apple. Its color is 90 percent red over a yellow background. Tree is vigorous, spreading and an annual bearer. Liberty is resistant to apple scab, cedar apple rust, fire blight and mildew.

**Nova Spy**– This apple harvests mid-season, and has a sweet, pleasant flavor, making it very good for fresh eating. It bakes well and is a good keeper. This variety has shown good resistance to apple scab.

**Pink Lady®**– Fruit develops 85-100% full pink color at the time of maturity. Fruit shows little internal browning after long term storage.

## APRICOT

**OrangeRed®**- The fruit develops a red blush over a bright orange ground color. Fruit texture is firm and fruit quality is very good.

**Robada**- The most notable attribute is its very large fruit size. It's one of the largest apricots on the market. Robada is freestone, finishes with a red blush and the flesh is bright orange. The flavor is outstanding with a nice balance between acid and sugar.

## CHERRY

**Montmorency**- Meet America's most popular tart cherry for pies and preserves. The Montmorency cherry tree is a cold-hardy hybrid species that ripens early in the season. The medium-large, bright red fruit has a firm yellow flesh; clear juice; and a rich, tart flavor that bakers and jam makers love.

## PEACH

**Messina®**- The fruit is very large, highly colored, with excellent firmness and fruit quality. The trees are very vigorous, productive and resistant to bacterial spot.

**Redhaven**- This variety is vigorous, very bud-hardy and productive. Fruit is medium-sized and colors to a brilliant red, with a yellow-flesh. Redhaven ripens towards the beginning of the season.

## PEAR

**Golden Russet Bosc**- The fruit on this vigorous tree type is long and uniform in shape. Fruit is juicy, crunchy, and has a very sweet flavor. This European variety harvests toward the end of the season.

**Harrow Sweet**- A late-season European variety. The fruit size and appearance are similar to that of Bartlett; however, Harrow Sweet does develop an attractive blush. Trees should be thinned to maintain fruit size and avoid biennial bearing. This variety has shown very good resistance to fire blight.

**Potomac**- The fruit is moderate in size, averaging 2.5 inches. The flesh texture is moderately fine and buttery. The flavor is pleasingly sub-acid with a mild aroma. The tree is moderately vigorous, and produces mid-season. This European variety is resistant to fire blight.

**Shenandoah**- Fruit size is large with traditional sub-acid pear flavor. Blight resistance is good and similar to that of Seckel. Shenandoah stores very well for up to five months without breaking down.

## PLUM

**Fortune** - A mid/late season, Japanese-type plum. Fruit is medium to large, reddish-purple and very firm with yellow flesh. The trees are upright and vigorous. Cross pollination with other Japanese varieties is recommended, such as Satsuma.

**Santa Rosa** - A large, reddish-purple plum with yellow flesh, which produces mid-season. The fruit is firm with excellent quality. One of the most frequently planted Japanese plums. Considered self-fertile and a good pollinizer.

**Satsuma** - A very distinctive, mid-season, dark red plum with red flesh. The fruit is oval-shaped, medium in size and very sweet. The tree is upright and very productive.

## Tree Guards



Light-weight and heavy-duty! These perforated plastic spirals last for years. Apply just after planting. Adjust the coil throughout the year to make sure it hasn't become too tight against the trunk and remove any grass that's grown inside. Avoid hitting tree guards with string trimmers or other lawn equipment, which can damage a tree guard and girdle trees.

## Low-Growing Wildflower & Grass Mix

Specifically designed to provide erosion and sediment control and color on low-fertility sites. After the establishment year, this meadow mix may be mowed annually. This would preferably be in the spring prior to onset of new growth, but it may be after the meadow ceases blooming in the fall. Mix formulations are subject to change without notice depending on the availability of existing and new products. While the formula may change, the guiding philosophy and function of the mix will not.

### Mix Composition:

- 66.9% *Festuca ovina*, Variety Not Stated (Sheep Fescue, Variety Not Stated)
- 17.0% *Lolium multiflorum* (Annual Ryegrass)
- 6.0% *Linum perenne* (Perennial Blue Flax)
- 2.5% *Chrysanthemum maximum* (Shasta Daisy)
- 2.0% *Coreopsis lanceolata* (Lanceleaf Coreopsis)
- 2.0% *Rudbeckia hirta* (Blackeyed Susan)
- 1.0% *Chamaecrista fasciculata*, PA Ecotype (Partridge Pea, PA Ecotype)
- 1.0% *Papaver rhoeas*, Red (Corn Poppy, Red)
- 0.4% *Achillea millefolium* (Common Yarrow)
- 0.4% *Asclepias tuberosa* (Butterfly Milkweed)
- 0.3% *Aster oblongifolius*, PA Ecotype (Aromatic Aster, PA Ecotype)
- 0.2% *Pycnanthemum tenuifolium* (Narrowleaf Mountainmint)
- 0.1% *Penstemon canescens* (Eastern Gray Beardtongue)
- 0.1% *Penstemon digitalis* (Tall White Beardtongue)
- 0.1% *Zizia aurea*, PA Ecotype (Golden Alexanders, PA Ecotype)

**Seeding Rate:** 20-40 lb per acre
